

### French Quarter Management District

The statutory purpose of the French Quarter Management District (FQMD) is to strengthen the District as a vital component of Louisiana's tourism industry; aid in the preservation of the District's architecture, quaint charm and tout ensemble; beautify the District's appearance; improve public safety, foster quality experiences and quality of life within the District; and improve commercial and residential vitality. The statutory functions of the FQMD include strategic planning, business and commercial development activities and administering capital improvement funds.



#### Mission

The French Quarter Management District ("FQMD") is a state entity created in 2007 by the Louisiana Legislature as a means for the residential and business communities to work together to protect, preserve, and maintain the world-famous French Quarter as a safe, clean, vibrant, and friendly neighborhood.

### Public Safety

For five years the Supplemental Police Patrol Program ("SPPP") proactively patrols French Quarter streets to help the NOPD deter crime. It uses a mobile application that allows businesses, residents, visitors, and employees to easily report crimes in progress. The SPPP patrols the French Quarter 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The initiative has been credited by the NOPD as having a positive impact on violent crime, including the removal of guns, drugs, and criminals from the French Quarter. Louisiana State Police Troop "N" now monitors the app as well.

#### French Quarter Security Assessment

To further support of the FQMD's mission to identify and implement strategies for improving public safety throughout the French Quarter, FQMD has engaged an investigation and corporate intelligence firm to conduct a 2019 Security Study. This Security Study will review the current security and safety infrastructure in the French Quarter, as well as the need, cost, and effectiveness of the French Quarter's multiple security efforts and resources: the Louisiana State Police, French Market Corporation, Downtown Development District, and FQMD's Supplemental Police Program, which together represent nearly \$9M in annual security costs for the 8th District's French Quarter footprint (in addition to the NOPD's \$9M security budget for the 8th District). This assessment will result in actionable recommendations around how to most effectively and efficiently deploy these resources moving forward.



#### Quality of Life: Advocacy in Action

Since its inception—and in accordance with its enabling legislation—the FQMD has continuously supported measures that affect the quality of life of French Quarter residents, visitors, business owners, and employees. The FQMD regularly provides feedback to City departments regarding sanitation and drainage issues in the neighborhood, as well as conditions of sidewalks, traffic signage, and road conditions.

#### Sanitation: City Contract

- Reviewed existing Sanitation contract which exposed multiple unfulfilled contractor requirements
- Spurred follow-up by the Sanitation Dept. to enforce contract compliance



### Quality of Life: Infrastructure

### Sidewalks

Comprehensive bi-annual assessment of sidewalk hazards are compiled by the FQMD Livability Committee totally ~ 140 hours of volunteers' time each survey .

Sidewalk conditions are assessed based on tripping and wheelchair mobility hazard.

The Sidewalk Assessment is utilized when advocating the Department of Public Works to prioritize the critical needs for repair.

# Streetlights

Every six months, the FQMD Livability Committee conducts an audit of French Quarter streetlights to identify missing and non-working lamp posts in need of replacement.

These efforts continue to result in tremendous improvements to neighborhood lighting and crime deterrence.

Resulted in allocation of, \$670,000 for lighting installation across 51 locations in 2019 from French Quarter Improvement Fund.

# Trash Cans

Advocating City's Department of Sanitation resulted French Quarter Improvement Fund allocations for:

Installation of 84 new iron litter cans

Retrofitting 100 Big Belly solar litter cans with graffiti wrap


