- V. Discussion of the Mayor's Concepts for "Reimaging the French Quarter"

Ms. Holmes provided an update on the cancelation of the External Tiger team calls in early September. There is a call scheduled for next week to revisit the Mayor's Internal Tiger Team progress in relation to Outdoor Dining pilot, French Market Place pedestrian mall pilot program, and future design charettes. Ms. Holmes recapped the results of the Hospitality Workers survey done in conjunction with the District C staff, attached.

- a. Sidewalk repairs by Karley D. Frankic
 There are two open work orders for sidewalk repairs:
 - 1. Barracks Street (N. Rampart to river)
 - 2. Gov. Nicholls (N. Rampart to river)

The City anticipates doing Ursulines, St. Philip and Dumaine next (N. Rampart to river for all). Depending on the funds left at this point, will do Burgundy, Dauphine, Bourbon, Royal, Chartres, and Decatur (Esplanade to Dumaine). This scope is prone to change depending on the amount of work needed on a block-by-block basis and if additional funds become available.

There are some things that are related to sidewalk repairs such as drainage point repairs that are only done when the drainage issue is determined to be impacting the sidewalk quality. The work on Barracks is around \$300K. Assuming similar levels of work on the other streets, the remaining budget will allow the City to address all the way to Dumaine then address some issues on upriver-downriver streets if funding is still available. It the City encounters more needs on other streets, this will impact cost of repairs and how far the existing budget will carry us.

It is a standard specification that historic street name tiles being retained, or reinstalled, when sidewalks are repaired in all of City contracts including Hard Rock's contract.

b. Recommendation to the Board of Commissioners (action item)

Ms. Mulla McGovern made the motion to approve the *attached* recommendation by the Livability Committee to the Board of Commissioners regarding the Mayor's plan for "Reimaging the French Quarter". Ms. Thomas seconded the motion, and it was approved.

c. French Quarter Loading Zone Permit

One of the recommendations of the mayor's plan is to restrict delivery times within the District. It has been discussed over time the possibility of creating a delivery parking pass. In conversation with the Louisiana Restaurant Association president. This may be a possibility of the revenues from such a parking pass were used to pay for parking enforcement in loading zones to assure that delivery vehicles are not impeded by illegally parked vehicles from using those spaces.

d. RTA Circulator Bus

The \$1M Katrina Relief CDBG-DR appropriation from the spring special session of the state legislature could be used for replacement of the RTA Circulator Shuttle. Ms. Frankic has spoken with the planning department at RTA and they are working up a budget for operations. Once a budget is done, identifying a source for the startup operations would be the next step before going back to the Office of Community Development.
