 - a. Streetlight installation by Eric Smith

Mr. Smith reported that there were no expenditures from the French Quarter Improvement Fund this month. He noted that the Project Manager for the streetlight installation project had been busy with Hurricane Zeta response so he did not have an update on the project. He will forward an update to Ms. Frankic when it is available.

- V. Discussion of the Mayor's Concepts for "Reimaging the French Quarter"
 - a. Parklet & French Market Place pilots update by Erin Holmes

Mrs. Holmes reported that the City announced the commencement of the French Market Place pilot last Friday to kickoff the following day. It includes metal tables and chairs, umbrellas and temporary barricades. It will continue on the weekends. There was a design charette announced today for November 16th at 6:00 pm. See flyer below. Mrs. Holmes reported that the parklet program has been expanded outside of the DDD. The working team is trying to get details on the criteria for which parking spaces are eligible to clarify potential impacts to residential parking spaces and loading zones that effect residents and businesses access. The City also announced an Outdoor Dining Grant Program for up to

VIII. New business


