Certification of Inability to Operate Due to Lack of Quorum

In accordance with the Executive Proclamation JBE 2020-117 issued by Governor John Bel Edwards on September 11, 2020, Louisiana Revised Statutes 42:17.1 and concurrence by the Attorney General on March 19, 2020, this notice shall serve as certification of the French Quarter Management District's inability to otherwise operate in accordance with the Louisiana Open Meetings Law due to a lack of quorum as a result of the COVID-19 public health emergency. These matters are critical to the continuation of the business of the public body and are not able to be postponed to a meeting that can be held in accordance with other provisions provided for in the Open Meetings Law (LA R.S. 42:11 et. seq.) due to a legal requirement or other deadline that cannot be postponed or delayed by the public body.

Pursuant to Louisiana Revised Statutes 42:17.1 the French Quarter Management District will provide for attendance at its Parity Team Meeting on 19 November 2020, at 11:10 am via video/telephone conference in order to obtain a quorum of its members. Therefore, in accordance with JBE 2020-117 and LA R.S. 42:17.1, the French Quarter Management District's meeting on November 19th in a manner that will allow for observation and input by members of the public, as set forth in the notice posted on November 18, 2020. All other Open Meetings Law requirements have been met.
