Comment on Agenda Item 6:

Unfortunately I have a meeting conflict today so cant participate in the meeting. I do want to make the following remarks:

I strongly believe that it is essential that FQMD start working collaboratively with the Mayor Office is to develop and finalize the CEA for the FQ EDD funds.

Also, the ballot language, in my view, will not convinced the residents of the Quarter to vote YES. Further definition of how the funds will be spent needs to be included in the CEA and negotiated with the City by no later than the end of February.

For example, the \$2 million needs to be dedicated to continuance and growth of the existing supplemental police Blue Light patrols and its App. That, in my view, is what the voters want plus, with the loss of the State Police, we need the expanded FQ Task Force.

The ballot language puts FQMD in the Public Safety and Security business with all the risks and liabilities that goes along with that. Is that want FQMD wants?

That can be minimized by NOT making the program a Detail and having the Officers work directly for NOPD on an overtime basis.

Note: A \$2m program would double the size of the 2019 FQ Task Force and require a pool of up to 60 Patrol Officers.












Theron Carr B/M D.O.B 9/12/2002 (Habitual Offender)

FRENCH QUARTER MANAGEMENT DISTRICT BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS 2020/12/14 MOTION

"the French Quarter Management District (FQMD) supports placing the French Quarter Economic Development District sales tax on the April 24, 2021 ballot for the purpose of funding programming of supplemental POST certified patrols and public safety initiatives in the French Quarter administered by the FQMD"



FRENCH QUARTER ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT GOVERNING AUTHORITY 2021/01/14 RESOLUTION NO. R-2021-2

"Shall a .245% increase in the sales tax be levied within the boundaries of the French Quarter Economic Development District ("FQ EDD") (with the exception of such a levy on hotel rooms) to be collected on the sale at retail, the use, the lease or rental, the consumption and storage for use or the consumption of tangible personal property and sales of services within the boundaries of the FQ EDD for a period of five years, beginning May 1, 2021 and ending April 30, 2026 (an estimated \$2 million reasonably expected at this time to be collected as a result of the levy per year) for the purpose of funding POST Certified supplemental police patrols and homeless assistance services, with the initial \$2 million collected in any year dedicated to supplemental police patrols and any additional revenue to be divided between additional patrols and public safety programs (including homeless assistance), and administered by the French Quarter Management District for fiscal and operational oversight of the FQ EDD Trust Fund and services provided by such fund and subject to quarterly budget and expenditure reports to the City Council, to facilitate economic development within the FQ EDD?"
