## 2. Public Comment:

No written public comment was received.
3. Approval of previous meeting notes

Frances Hegenberger motioned to approve the previous meeting notes. Glade Bilby seconded the motion, and it was approved. Jane Cooper abstained due to her absence from the October Security and Enforcement Committee meeting.
4. Committee Chair's Comments

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The French Quarter Management District is a state political subdivision created by the Louisiana Legislature as a means for the residential and business communities to work together to protect, preserve and maintain the world famous French Quarter as a safe, clean, vibrant and friendly neighborhood for residents, businesses, and visitors.

Ms. Cooper welcomed the Committee members and guests and stated that she will be transitioning into the role of Chair of the Board of Commissioners in January but noted that she will still remain a Security and Enforcement (SEC) Committee member. She informed the Committee that Commissioner Christian Pendleton will be taking the role of Chair of the SEC Committee, while Committee member Jessica Dietz will be Vice-Chair. Ms. Cooper stated that she would like the Committee to review the goals that were made at the beginning of the year as well as the Committee's accomplishments and discuss new goals for 2024 at the December Committee meeting. She noted that one of the objectives for today's meeting is for the Committee to reach a conclusion regarding the expansion of the Upper Quarter Patrol (UQP) with the State appropriation funding, adding that the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement (CEA) and the State appropriation budget need to be finalized by the end of December.
5. Presentation - Presentation of Eighth District Crime Statistics and the Supplemental Police Patrol Program. To Present: Lt. Chuck Ward

See attached report. Sgt. Marc Boudreau was in attendance and presented the Eighth District crime statistics to the Committee. He noted that $72.6 \%$ of shifts were filled for the month of October. Cpt. LeJon Roberts reported that the NOPD had nothing unusual to report and noted that everything went well during Bayou Classic weekend.
6. Presentation - Presentation of Travelers Aid Society of Greater New Orleans Case Management October Report. To Present: Karley D. Frankic

See attached report. Ms. Cooper stated that she would like Angela Owczarek of the Traveler's Aid Society of Greater New Orleans (TASGNO) to attend the December SEC Committee meeting to discuss the structure of the TASGNO report. Karley Frankic reviewed the TASGNO report with the Committee and noted that for the month of October, 31 chronically homeless individuals were contacted, one individual was moved into housing, and three individuals returned to homelessness. Ms. Frankic stated that there are still ongoing challenges with the State voucher program, causing a slowdown with placing individuals into housing who have completed all the necessary documents and received housing vouchers. Ms. Cooper suggested that the Committee discuss TASGNO's overall data for the year when Ms. Owczarek attends next month's meeting. She asked Eric Smith if the definition of "chronically homeless" that applies to TASGNO's qualifications would be the same for the Rapid Rehousing Program, noting that on the TASGNO report an individual must be unhoused for a year or more to be considered chronically homeless. Mr. Smith replied that when individuals are applying for State housing vouchers, the 12 month mark is an important qualification, but noted that this would be case by case for the Rapid Rehousing Program, pointing out that the program is meant to bridge individuals into long-term housing vouchers. He stated that one of the goals is to house individuals who match the term of long-term homeless and already have State housing vouchers in hand.

## 7. Discussion - Discussion by Committee of French Quarter Economic Development District 2024 Budget. To Present: Jane Cooper

See attached document. Ms. Cooper noted that the budget that was included in the SEC Committee meeting packet emailed on Friday was the 2024 French Quarter Economic Development District (FQEDD) budget that was approved by the Board at the November $13^{\text {th }}$ Board of Commissioners meeting. She noted that this budget did not include the funding for the Rapid Rehousing Program or the Covenant House Outreach proposals, but pointed out that the Board did approve of the Covenant House funding with the understanding that a supplemental budget would be created to reflect this revision. Ms. Cooper reviewed the supplemental 2024 FQEDD budget with the Committee, noting the added-in figures for Covenant House and the Rapid Rehousing Program.

## a. Rapid Rehousing Program Flex Fund

Ms. Cooper reported that at last Monday's Agreement Monitors meeting an agreement was reached between the Monitors to reduce the funding request for the Rapid Rehousing Program by $\$ 116,496.56$. Ms. Cooper reviewed the new figures with the Committee, noting that a Rapid Rehousing case manager position was eliminated as well as administration costs and housing navigation services. She noted that the landlord incentive figure has been reduced from $\$ 30,000$ to $\$ 17,468$. Ms. Cooper stated that if the Committee members would like more details about the budget breakdown within the program, to look at the program's budget narrative for further information. She informed the Committee that the Board will be voting on this matter in December but wanted to allow Committee members time in today's meeting to discuss how they felt about allocating funds

towards the Rapid Rehousing Program and to ask Mr. Smith any questions they may have about the program. Ms. Dietz asked how the 20 individuals will be identified for the pilot program. Mr. Smith answered that it will ultimately be up to TASGNO to decide but stated that the individuals most eligible for the program will be the ones who have already done all of the necessary steps and paperwork and have received a State housing voucher but cannot get into housing. Ms. Frankic noted that TASGNO would be pulling from their existing client base in the French Quarter for this program. Ms. Dietz asked if TASGNO had 20 individuals in mind for the pilot. Mr. Smith answered yes and noted that TASGNO has 67 individuals who would be eligible. Ms. Hegenberger asked if those selected for the pilot program would be residents of the French Quarter. Mr. Smith replied yes, they are long-term unhoused individuals based in the French Quarter. Joshua Grippo stated that he is in support of the program as long as key performance indices (KPIs) are created and monitored so that the Committee can measure the successes of the program. He added that a number of safety issues in the French Quarter are those that deal with the unhoused, pointing out that this program could help to alleviate some of the stress on the NOPD's manpower. Cpt. Roberts pointed out that it is important to get to the root causes of the homelessness issue, noting his concern of the unhoused populations picking up and moving from one area to another throughout the City. Ms. Hegenberger asked if this would be an annual expense. Mr. Smith answered no, stating that it would be a one-time cost. Ms. Cooper agreed with Mr. Grippo and stated that as a French Quarter resident and representative of the Vieux Carre Property Owners, Residents, and Associates (VCPORA) she supports the Rapid Rehousing Program and believes that it is an innovate solution.

Ms. Dietz asked if there were target areas within the French Quarter that the program would focus on. Cpt. Roberts replied that the areas that they would like to be prioritized are Jackson Square and the Moon Walk, pointing out that criminal activity under the wharf with unhoused individuals has been a large area of concern. Mr. Smith stated that TASGNO can coordinate with the Eighth District on the details of prioritizing these areas. Bob Simms suggested adding the French Market area to this list. Ms. Cooper asked if it would be possible in the TASGNO report to identify if individuals are being moved from these locations into housing. Mr. Smith answered yes, stating that he does not believe it would be an issue with Personally Identifiable Information (PII) rules. Mr. Bilby asked Mr. Smith what would happen if they do not get 20 landlords to sign up for the pilot program. Mr. Smith answered that the funds would go back into the FQEDD Trust Fund. Ms. Cooper asked what the other funding sources are besides the FQEDD. Mr. Smith answered that the primary funding source is a $\$ 15 \mathrm{M}$ federal grant, as well as funding from private donors. He noted that the overall cost to house all the homeless individuals in Orleans Parish would be $\$ 32 \mathrm{M}$, and currently half of these funds are raised. Mr. Smith added that implementing the Rapid Rehousing Program as soon as possible can help to create positive long-term changes. Mr. Bilby asked Mr. Smith if there were other organizations that the City is attempting to get funding from. Mr. Smith replied yes and noted that Nathaniel Fields, the Director of Homeless Services and Strategy, would be able to speak more specifically on the donors. Mr. Grippo asked who Mr. Fields and the Homeless Office would be reporting to during the program. Mr. Smith answered that Mr. Fields will be supervised under the Mayor's office. Ms. Hegenberger asked what percentage of crimes in the French Quarter are committed by the unhoused community. Cpt. Roberts answered that a large percentage of daily property crimes and petty thefts are committed by the unhoused. He added that serious violent crimes have been linked with the unhoused in the last two quarters, noting that there have been several cuttings as well as a fatal shooting under the wharf during Essence Festival. Cpt. Roberts added that the narcotic dependency that many of the unhoused individuals struggle with can also impact crime. Mr. Grippo pointed out that those involved in the program will have wraparound services available to them to help with dependency issues.

## 8. Discussion - Discussion by Committee of Louisiana State 2023-2024 Appropriation Projects. To Present: Jane Cooper

See attached document. Ms. Cooper reviewed the proposed program recommendations for the State appropriation funding with the Committee and stated that it is the Committee's responsibility to look at the details of expanding the UQP and vote on allocating the State funds to this proposal so that it can move forward to the December Board meeting. She reminded the Committee that Senator Harris feels strongly that public safety in the French Quarter should be a priority with this funding. Ms. Cooper reviewed the UQP expansion proposal and budget recommendations with the Committee, noting that the requested funding would be one third of the State appropriation, which must be spent in full by the end of June 2024. She asked Cpt. Roberts how he felt about the proposal. Cpt. Roberts replied that the UQP is a valuable asset to the Eighth District. He stated that the UQP and Matt Pincus play a vital part in helping the NOPD and added that he was in full support of the proposed expansion. Cpt. Roberts stated that he believes it would be beneficial to onboard and expand the number of individuals that are POST certified and added that he would like to modify some details regarding communication and deployment.

Cpt. Roberts stated that the Governor Elect may bring back the State troopers and informed the Committee that this could help him to move forward with several of his plans for the Eighth District, one of which is bringing back the mounted patrols in the French Quarter. Cpt. Roberts added that he would also like to increase foot patrols in the major problem areas throughout the district.

Sgt. Boudreau asked what percent of the UQP shifts are being filled weekly. Ms. Frankic answered that between 80-90\% of the shifts are filled. Mr. Simms pointed out the importance of making sure the officers that are placed in the high priority problem areas are proactive and able to handle patrolling these locations. He suggested that the UQP officers could assist NOPD in transporting subjects to Central Lockup. Cpt. Roberts replied that this would be beneficial for the NOPD and noted that the State police can assist with transporting. Mr. Bilby motioned that the Security and Enforcement Committee endorses the expansion of the Upper Quarter Patrol, subject to final revisions, at a cost of $\$ 468,350.00$. Mr. Grippo and Ms. Dietz seconded the motion, and it was approved. Ms. Cooper suggested that Mr. Pincus attend the December Committee meeting to further discuss the inner details of the UQP expansion with the Committee.

## 9. Discussion - Discussion by Committee of Illegal Vending Sweeps

Cpt. Roberts reported that the Louisiana Office of Alcohol and Tobacco Control (ATC) is cutting back to performing the illegal vending sweeps to twice a month instead of twice a week. He stated that the NOPD is still pushing forward and will be performing random sweeps throughout the week with 50-60 people, including Community Liaison Officers.
10. Presentation - Presentation of Updates on City Safety Coordination Efforts by City Chief Administrative Office. To Present: Alex Dunkenberger
a. Supplemental Police Patrol App Request for Proposals Status

Mr. Smith reported on Mr. Dunkenberger's behalf and stated that a recent preliminary conference call regarding the Request for Proposal (RFP) took place and noted that two interested vendors called in. He stated that responses are due by December $11^{\text {th }}$.
b. FQEDD Code Enforcement Inspector Hiring Status

Mr. Smith stated that as of October $26^{\text {th }}$, the requisition for the position was approved. He added that the latest update from Code Enforcement is that there currently is a candidate going through the interview process for the position.

## c. Supplemental Parking Enforcement Shifts Filled

Mr. Smith said that a meeting will be scheduled with members of the Eighth District and Parking Enforcement to discuss plans for 2024.
d. New Patrol Vehicle Wrapping and Light Installation Status

Mr. Smith stated that he did not have updates but believes that this is still in the procurement process.
11. New Business- To consider and take action upon any other matters that may properly come before the French Quarter Management District Security and Enforcement Committee
Mr. Pendleton asked what the status is regarding the streetlight repairs in the French Quarter and pointed out that this is a major area of focus for both the Livability Committee and the Security \& Enforcement Committee. He added that one third of the streetlights are out in the neighborhood. Ms. Frankic answered that the Department of Public Works (DPW) just hired a Deputy Director, but they have not filled the Director position yet. Mr. Smith reported that he requested that the DPW prepare a full report on the French Quarter streetlight repairs that have been conducted throughout 2023 and what is budgeted for repairs in 2024. He stated that he should have the report by December $1^{\text {st }}$ and will forward this information to the Committee. He noted that the new RFP is out, but there is currently no vendor. He added that this can be a priority moving forward into 2024.
12. Next meeting date:

The next scheduled meeting of the Committee is Monday, December 18 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ 2023, at 11:00 am .

## Budget Request Narrative - French Quarter Economic Development District

The Unity-led Unsheltered Plan and nearly \$15M award from HUD aim to house 420 persons experiencing homelessness and living unsheltered. This plan leverages federal resources, local public and private dollars, existing landlord engagement services, and the UNITY warehouse of donated furnishings and household items to support unhoused persons' transition to permanent housing. The infusion of federal dollars will be matched by $\$ 500,000$ in cash commitments from the private sector to support rapid rehousing rental subsidies paired with federally funded services. Additional commitments for leveraged services are also a central part of the unsheltered plan. These services remain critical and will be fully leveraged as the city and UNITY work to further amplify this initiative. The opportunity to leverage these services is timecritical and further investments allow us to maximize the number of persons moved into permanent housing.

With the addition of the City's new Director of Homeless Services and Strategy Nate Fields, Clutch Consulting, and targeted political will and resources, we are now looking to expand the unsheltered initiative to include targeted encampment decommissioning City-wide, particularly in the inner core. This will expand the goal of rehousing 420 individuals experiencing unsheltered homelessness to 750 individuals and aims to reach low or no unsheltered homelessness within the next 18 months.

With this expansion comes the need for additional cash resources to support enhanced landlord engagement and the holding of units in the market so we can move entire encampments into housing all at once, as well as move-in kits to ensure individuals are able to remain in housing. Further, we are working in partnership with municipal services to maintain the closure of an encampment once everyone is housed so that we can take our services to the next encampment and effectively manage our inner core.

We believe the French Quarter Management District has a vested interest in achieving low or no unsheltered homelessness and implementing more effective long-term management practices within the French Quarter. The existing partnership with the City, the French Market Corporation, and Travelers Aid of Greater New Orleans, funded partially by the French Quarter Economic Development District sales tax, has seen objective, on-the-ground progress in reducing long-term homelessness. The confluence of new grant funding, public-private partnerships, and voucher funding present a unique and time-sensitive opportunity for an expanded unsheltered initiative specific to the French Quarter. There is an immediate opportunity to best leverage these resources by adding 20 rehousing packages as a start for individuals experiencing homelessness in the French Quarter, allowing all parties to take advantage of this combination of efforts.

## Travelers Aid Partnership

As of the end of September, Travelers Aid's two FQ outreach workers had, in response to the needs of 220 unique unhoused individuals in the French Quarter, moved 16 people into permanent housing, provided 101 connections to some form of treatment, provided 122 enrollments in public benefits, and replaced or obtained 98 vital documents. Because even this large volume of work represents only a portion of what could be done in the French Quarter in terms of outreach services for unhoused individuals, Travelers Aid has recommended the addition of a third street outreach case manager to its team in the 2024 budget year and asked for the provision of a vehicle to make the client transportation portion of this work more feasible.

Notably, however, almost all this work done by street outreach case managers is done for clients while they are still on the streets and is limited in its pace by systemic factors such as voucher availability and affordable housing availability.

As Travelers Aid has noted in multiple months' previous reports to the FQEDD, even once clients complete all steps related to the housing application process, they may then wait weeks and months to be approved for a housing subsidy voucher and then find an affordable apartment they can move into, especially given recent slow-downs and intermittent stoppages in state voucher availability.

Then, after move-in, unhoused individuals continue to require significant support to adjust to housing - if they have been on the streets for years, they are likely unfamiliar with tasks like paying their rental portion, contacting a landlord to make a repair, or generally adjusting to being a neighbor and building a life with goals beyond surviving another night on the streets. While most individuals matched to housing voucher subsidies are also paired with housing case management, not all individuals do get this case management assistance in the same quality or quantity. This past year, this has resulted in our street outreach case managers frequently being called upon to assist their former clients who have been in housing for weeks or months already but who don't know or trust anyone else to take them to the doctor, replace their SNAP benefits card, or help them to navigate a difficult situation with a neighbor.

Thus, this program seeks to address two of these issues that simply cannot functionally be solved by outreach case managers - (1) the wait to receive a housing subsidy and find an affordable apartment at the voucher price in the first place and (2) the sudden drop off some clients face when transitioning from receiving intensive outreach case management from Travelers Aid to living in housing and receiving varied levels of supportive case management, and thus continuing to rely on outreach case managers for long-term support instead.

This program will address voucher wait times by simply providing rental subsidies directly to 20 individuals in the French Quarter, eliminating the need for these individuals to complete such intensive applications processes and then wait in a region-wide queue for subsidy assignment. This rapid rehousing model is used nationwide and is currently being used successfully to assist other areas with dense homelessness in New Orleans. This rapid access to rental assistance can also be life-preserving for some of the sickest members of our unhoused population: notably, multiple individuals the Travelers Aid outreach team has assisted into housing thus far this year from the French Quarter have had grave medical conditions that have worsened deeply in their time waiting for housing, including in one instance in which one frail, older woman passed away after working closely with outreach to complete all steps of the housing application paperwork after waiting for over a month for voucher assignment.

This program will also shorten the time individuals spend looking for housing once a housing voucher subsidy has been assigned to them. By relying on the landlord incentives budgeted in the program, the housing case manager and leasing services specialist provided for in the budget will be able to more rapidly place these 20 individuals into housing because they will be able to offer landlords an average of $\$ 900$ per client to get them into more desirable apartments. Then, once the leasing services specialist has executed a lease for the client, the housing case manager will continue to visit each client multiple times per month, ensuring they have consistent, high quality case management until they can be bridged to a longer-term housing and case management program. Similarly, individuals will be supported to stay in their homes because the program has afforded for move-in kits containing furniture and essential items like cleaning supplies, sheets, hygiene supplies, cookware, and more - all the items that make an apartment or house a home.

In sum, this program seeks to augment the outreach case management services that Travelers Aid is already providing by creating a more rapid, life-saving pathway for up to 20 individuals to receive rental subsidies, move into high-quality, safe housing as enabled by landlord incentives administered by a leasing specialist, and then be supported to remain in stable housing by a housing case manager (who will assist in addressing their case management needs inclusive of connections to treatment, benefits, vital documents, and more) for up to 12 months until a permanent subsidy and case management support program are available.

## Upper Quarter Patrol Expansion Plan

After evaluating problematic areas within the patrol perimeter, it has been determined that 700 Canal St. continues to be an area that warrants additional law enforcement presence. It is strongly encouraged to position officers in vehicles with active emergency lights for the entirety of the shift. These supplemental assignments will be scheduled from (7pm-8pm) - (3am-4am) on Thursday, Friday, Saturday \& Sunday. Deployment strategy will consist of 2 single manned vehicles in the 700 block positioned in the right travel lane of Canal St. for maximum visibility.

A 2nd problematic area outside of the existing patrol perimeter has been identified in the 100, 200 and 300 blocks of Decatur. This area has experienced increasing of criminal activity, most notably in the late night and early morning hours of the day. It is proposed that a similar deployment as outlined above in the 700 Canal St. plan. Officers will provide visibility utilizing vehicles with active lights in static positions. These positions within the zone can be modified situationally. For example, if there is a greater need for a presence at the intersection of Decatur and lberville, on duty personnel can mobilize and respond accordingly. In consideration of scheduling.

In order to attract Post Certified Officers with vehicles to this assignment, an hourly rate of $\$ 58$ will be recommended. Given the shift time, days of the week and location of the assignments, this will be a positive starting point in identifying personnel.

Because 6 of the 42 encountered individuals were housed prior to or during this month, this means $2.77 \%$ of ( 1 of the 36) encountered individuals who were still homeless by September $30^{\text {th }}$ are connected to housing vouchers (which could pay their rent) but are not connected to actual available housing where they can use their vouchers.

## Outreach Successes:

This month, the outreach team surpassed a cumulative of 100 successful instances of aiding unhoused individuals to connect to treatment, enroll in public benefits, or obtain their vital documents. In the first ten months of this outreach project, in each month, outreach workers have provided an average of 12 connections to treatment, 13 enrollments in public benefits, and have replaced or obtained 10 vital documents for unhoused individuals. These vital services help unhoused individuals survive on the streets, improve their wellbeing, and help them prove their eligibility for housing programs long-term.

Additionally, an individual who has been homeless in Jackson Square and Latrobe Park for almost twenty years (his first record of being homeless in the French Quarter was entered into the state system in 2004) was approved for a housing voucher this month. This individual is an older gentleman who struggles with literacy and who needed significant assistance to complete the housing application process. He and his outreach case manager viewed multiple potential apartments in the last week of the month after he was awarded his housing voucher. The gentleman was able to select an apartment he preferred close to downtown and will move into it in early November after some repairs are made.

## Outreach Challenges:

## Continued State Voucher Program Pause

A major challenge of the past now-four months has been the continued pause of new referrals into the state permanent housing program due to requests from the state so that their staff have more time to staff cases of incoming referrals. We wrote about this extensively in prior months and so won't describe the situation again. At current time, we have several clients who have completed all steps of the housing application process but who are waiting for a voucher to be assigned to them and we have limited insight on when voucher matches will be able to be made for them. Notably, about 15 clients from across the city were newly referred into this program in late October upon the admittance of a small number of new clients into the program - one of these clients was an individual unhoused in the French Quarter, but others continue to wait to be assigned to a voucher so that they can move into housing.

## Increased Anxiety about Having IDs in the French Quarter

Multiple clients have reported that police officers are increasingly stopping unhoused people to see their state IDs. This causes anxiety for our clients who either don't have an ID (variously due to bureaucratic barriers or due to having had their ID stolen while sleeping on the streets) or who would prefer to leave their vital documents in a safe place (in a case manager's office, at a friend's home, or elsewhere) due to the fear of loss or theft. Thus, some unhoused individuals in the French Quarter have begun to ask our outreach team with help in obtaining additional copies of their IDs so they can carry them around. For our outreach workers, the average ID replacement trip can take a week or more of planning and several hours out of a case manager's busy schedule, meaning the outreach team could end up spending more time and money replacing IDs than is necessary due to fears about police attention on unhoused people needing to prove who they are. Several unhoused individuals have also reported they feel uniquely targeted by this practice as they do not see housed individuals, workers, or tourists being stopped in the same way.

## Travelers Aid Response:

Regarding the state voucher slow down - we continue to advocate for all of our unhoused clients to be matched to voucher programs as quickly as possible, which has allowed us to have some vulnerable clients still matched to housing programs despite the state housing program voucher pause. Similarly, with the issue of our clients feeling increased anxiety about being stopped for their ID documents by police officers in the French Quarter, we continue to support our clients in obtaining and replacing their needed vital documents and seek to raise this issue to the attention of other French Quarter entities, such as the FMC and the FQEDD to whom we send this report.

## Systemic Challenges Highlighted by these Cases:

As we have written about before, the state voucher pause highlights how all elements of a homeless response system (a) intake and application processes provided by outreach workers/shelters/drop-in centers, (b) voucher availability, and (c) the availability of affordable housing to all people (whether they have vouchers or not) must all work in tandem together to ensure a smooth flow of unhoused individuals into housing. Similarly, the issue of unhoused individuals reporting that they face increased scrutiny by police officers in the French Quarter about their possession of their IDs on their persons highlights the extent to which unhoused individuals face so many day-to-day stressors and barriers in their journey through this system that can make the entrance into housing a longer, more drawn-out process than it should be. Many unhoused individuals request constantly to reschedule appointments related to their housing and other goals, not because they are uninterested in services, but rather because the immediate needs of the day - whether those needs be related to complying with requests to find and produce ID documents, securing one's possessions in the rain, finding discrete locations to store one's belongings to prevent loss and theft, or maintaining one's health in the elements - may simply take precedence over working on long term goals like housing.
