# Summary of Month Activities

---

## **12/3/2025**

On Wednesday, December 3rd, 2025, at approximately 9:00 AM, Deputies Loy Madrigal and Joseph Lodwick were conducting vehicle patrol in the area of Decatur Street and Esplanade Avenue. While passing the front of Checkpoint Charlie, deputies observed a male subject wearing a blue jacket who appeared to be struggling to stand and stumbling on the sidewalk. Deputies exited their unit to check on the subject. Upon contact, the subject later self-identified as Travis Montminy. Montminy exhibited clear signs consistent with a possible drug overdose, including instability, decreased responsiveness, and difficulty remaining conscious. Deputies immediately notified dispatch of the situation and requested Emergency Medical Services (EMS). Dispatch advised that no EMS units were currently available. Deputies maintained physical support of the subject, who continued to have difficulty staying upright. At approximately 9:14 AM, Deputy Madrigal administered one (1) can of Narcan. A second (1) can of Narcan was administered at approximately 9:17 AM due to continued signs of overdose. Deputy Madrigal provided constant physical and verbal stimulation, including rubbing the subject's chest to keep him responsive while awaiting medical assistance. Shortly thereafter, the subject began to regain consciousness. An NOPD officer who arrived on scene provided supplemental oxygen to the subject. Members of the NOPD Fire Department then arrived and assisted with further medical support until EMS arrived on scene. EMS subsequently transported the subject to University Medical Center for further evaluation and treatment.

# Summary of Month Activities

---

## **12/13/2025**

On December 13, 2025, at approximately 12:00 PM, Deputies Madrigal, Lodwick, and Ramon Quesada were on vehicle patrol in the 500 block of Bienville Street when they were flagged down by Alvinisha Johnson, a City of New Orleans Parking Enforcement Officer. Ms. Johnson reported an incident that occurred on December 11, 2025, between approximately 2:00 PM and 2:30 PM, while she was actively writing a parking violation in the 100 block of Dauphine Street. She stated that a black male subject rode up to her on a bicycle and began yelling aggressively. Ms. Johnson stated that the subject used his right hand to pull a knife from his right waist area, while his left hand remained on the bicycle handlebar, and displayed the weapon toward her. She stated that the subject then fled the area on the bicycle in the direction of Canal Street. Ms. Johnson stated she felt threatened and feared for her safety. Ms. Johnson further stated that she recognized the subject, as she sees him on a daily basis during her parking enforcement duties, where he is commonly seen riding a bicycle and playing buckets in the French Quarter area. Ms. Johnson stated she immediately went to the NOPD Eighth District Police Station to report the incident. She later notified her supervisor and subsequently notified OPSO Deputy Madrigal when she observed the subject again while working. Deputies were advised that the subject was known to frequent the 100 block of Bourbon Street as a bucket drummer. An initial search of the area was conducted but the subject was not located at that time.

On December 14, 2025, at approximately 1:15 PM, Deputies Madrigal and Lodwick observed the subject later identified as Charles Bush, (DOB 11/10/2007), drumming buckets in the 100 block of Bourbon Street. When deputies approached, the subject immediately mounted a painted-over blue bicycle and fled toward the 900 block of Bienville Street, where he was detained. Upon inspection, the bicycle was identified as a NOLA Ride Share (Blue Bike) with VIN XT407125, which had been painted over and had the electronic tracking mechanism removed. The bicycle was confirmed stolen by Patrick Driscoll, a representative of NOLA Ride Share Bicycle, who took possession of the bicycle.

During a search incident to arrest, the subject was found to be in possession of approximately 4.0 grams of vegetable matter. The vegetable matter was properly secured and turned over to Central Evidence and Property (CE&P) for intake and processing. Ms. Johnson later positively identified Charles Bush from a photograph as the same individual who threatened her on December 11, 2025. It was also learned that Charles Bush had been previously arrested for a similar aggravated assault involving a machete against parking enforcement officers on September 11, 2025, under NOPD Item Number I-10885-25. Based on the victim's statement, positive identification, the subject's actions, possession of stolen property, and prior similar offense, probable cause was established. Charles Bush was placed under arrest and processed accordingly.
