2. Public Comment

No written public comments were received.

3. Motion – Consider a motion to approve the previous meeting notes

Joey DiFatta made a motion to approve the previous meeting notes. Lori Boyer seconded the motion, and it was approved.

4. Quality of Life Impact Report*, Mamie Gasperecz, Committee Chair

See attached document. Committee Chair Mamie Gasperecz reviewed the latest Committee impact report with the group. FQMD Executive Director Michelle Courseault made a note that she will add the previous quarter's stats as well as the previous year's stats to the monthly impact reports for comparison. Ms. Gasperecz reported that the FQMD has hired new legal counsel, a team of three attorneys- Jay Ginsberg, Al Rogert, and Jeff Dye, who will be attending the Livability Committee's July meeting. She stated that she will connect the new legal team with Sayde Finkel and the City's legal department via email in order to get discussions rolling regarding the new French Quarter Economic Development District (FQEDD) Cooperative Endeavor Agreement.

5. Strategic Discussion Focus: (30 mins)

a. 2027 Project Priorities (new budget timeline goal: July 2026)*

i. ID: PEDESTRIAN / VEHICLE / SIGNAGE

See attached document. The Committee discussed beginning the 2027 budget brainstorming with a focus on developing clear and detailed scopes for all initiatives for next year, as well as a five-year strategic outlook. Ms. Courseault stated that finalization of the 2027 budget will be voted on at the October Board of Commissioners meeting but noted that the City has requested to have a draft of the 2027 FQEDD budget submitted by July 24th. Over the next month, Ms. Gasperecz will conduct individual outreach to the Committee members to gather input on program priorities. She emphasized the importance of ensuring that the FQMD continues to provide support for City services, rather than replacing them. Ms. Courseault added that she will continue to have discussions with the DPW to ensure that all upcoming infrastructural initiatives align across all organizations. She stated that the FQMD will conduct a 2026 curb and signage assessment of the French Quarter using structured data collection tools like the

Fulcrum app, noting that this assessment data will then be sent to the DPW for the next steps. The Committee highlighted the need for reliable maintenance plans, and discussed the lessons learned from past infrastructure projects. Mr. DiFatta noted his concerns regarding the ordinance around residential driveway definitions and ongoing delays in addressing the remaining active driveway markings. Ms. Courseault stated that these markings will be addressed in the future but are not a part of the Street Markings Project Phase II scope. Ms. Finkel recommended that, once a consensus is reached among all of the FQMD Commissioners, to reach out to Councilman King to address this topic. The group also discussed uncertainty around future State appropriations funding, which may be reduced or redirected primarily toward patrols, potentially impacting other initiatives like recycling. Vice-Chair Erin Holmes emphasized the importance of developing flexible, year-over-year programming with ongoing maintenance, and reminded the Committee that unhoused services and infrastructure projects do fall within public safety and should be as much of a focus for the organization as funding the patrols. Ms. Courseault noted that she will continue reaching out to Senator Harris for clarity on the potential 2026-2027 State funding, adding that she will also provide the Committee with a budget breakdown of the previous State appropriations.

6. Updates:

a. Public Safety Street Markings Project Phase II

Ms. Courseault reported that the proposal for Phase II of the Street Markings Project was approved by the Board of Commissioners last Wednesday. She noted that she expects this phase of the project to be fully wrapped by the end of 2026.

b. Unhoused Strategic Alternative Proposal

Ms. Courseault reported that the new Unhoused Services pilot program is still anticipated to launch in July.

c. Public Safety Right of Way Guidelines Project

The Committee discussed procuring a consultant to develop infrastructure project guidelines through a Request for Qualifications (RFQ), as recommended by Committee member Robert Wingerter. The consultant will define the project scope and establish standardized procedures for agencies involved in infrastructure work, including Cox, the DPW, the Sewerage & Water Board of New Orleans, Entergy, and others, to ensure a consistent and citywide process. Ms. Courseault stated that coordination with the City's Infrastructure Council, the DPW, and the Vieux Carré Commission will be essential. Ms. Courseault and Mr. Wingerter will collaborate on refining the RFQ scope. She noted that all organizations must reach an agreement on the scope before issuing the RFQ, in order to ensure alignment with existing infrastructure planning efforts.

d. Full Time Position: Special Projects Manager

Ms. Gasperecz reported that interviews have been conducted with a final decision to be made soon.

7. New Business– To consider and take action upon any other matters that may properly come before the French Quarter Management District Livability Committee

No new business was discussed.

8. Adjournment

Mr. DiFatta made a motion to adjourn. Ms. Holmes seconded the motion, and the meeting adjourned at 11:59 PM.

The next scheduled meeting of the Committee is Monday, July 6th, 2026, at 11 AM.

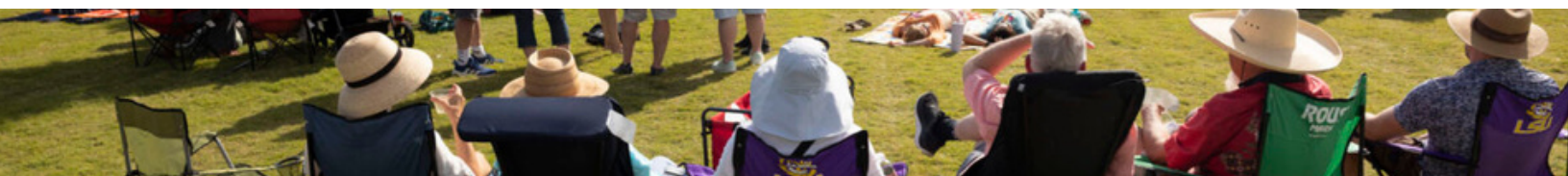

1. Manage State Appropriations Program for FQMD

- a. **Status** *Active*
- b. **Funding:** State of Louisiana
- c. **Notes:** FY25 Appropriation has been closed out and paid in full.

FY26 Execution. Paid 50% of projected budget in accordance with CEA. Q3 Report is being drafted by Sam with my oversight. A follow up Zoom meeting is scheduled for 6May. Sidewalks, Signage, Public RoW Guidelines. Coordination with DPW for work to be completed this year is ongoing. A formal sidewalk condition assessment is needed to better define the problem, what can and can't be done, establish our goals, how much that will cost, how long it will take to accomplish, and THEN draft a contractable scope of work.

FY27 Planning. Need to schedule a meeting/planning workshop to develop a draft plan with lead-up timeline. Target for finalized plan: 30Jun26 (D-90). Actively developing a planning procedures overview document for distribution and training. Update to follow.

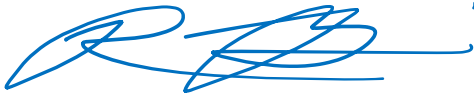

Highlights & Successes	During the April reporting period, Outreach and Program Services continued to maintain consistent engagement and meaningful connection with youth across the city. A total of 11 youth interactions were conducted citywide, including 9 within the French Quarter, with 6 repeat contacts reflecting ongoing relationship-building and trust with youth in need. Basic needs support remained a strong point of impact, with 9 care packages and hygiene kits distributed—more than doubling the previous month—demonstrating increased responsiveness to immediate needs in the community. Emergency services continued to play a critical role, with 17 shelter intakes and 5 overnight stays, along with 2 direct referrals from outreach to emergency shelter. These efforts reflect continued coordination between outreach and intake to ensure youth are connected to safe and stable environments. Wellness and supportive services remained a central focus, with 38 mental health visits, 60 counseling sessions, and 13 onsite medical visits provided. Notably, counseling services increased, highlighting a deepened level of engagement and ongoing support for youth navigating complex challenges. Overall, April reflects steady engagement, strengthened continuity of care, and a balanced approach across outreach, basic needs, emergency services, and wellness supports. The data underscores a continued commitment to meeting youth where they are while providing consistent, coordinated pathways to stability and well-being.

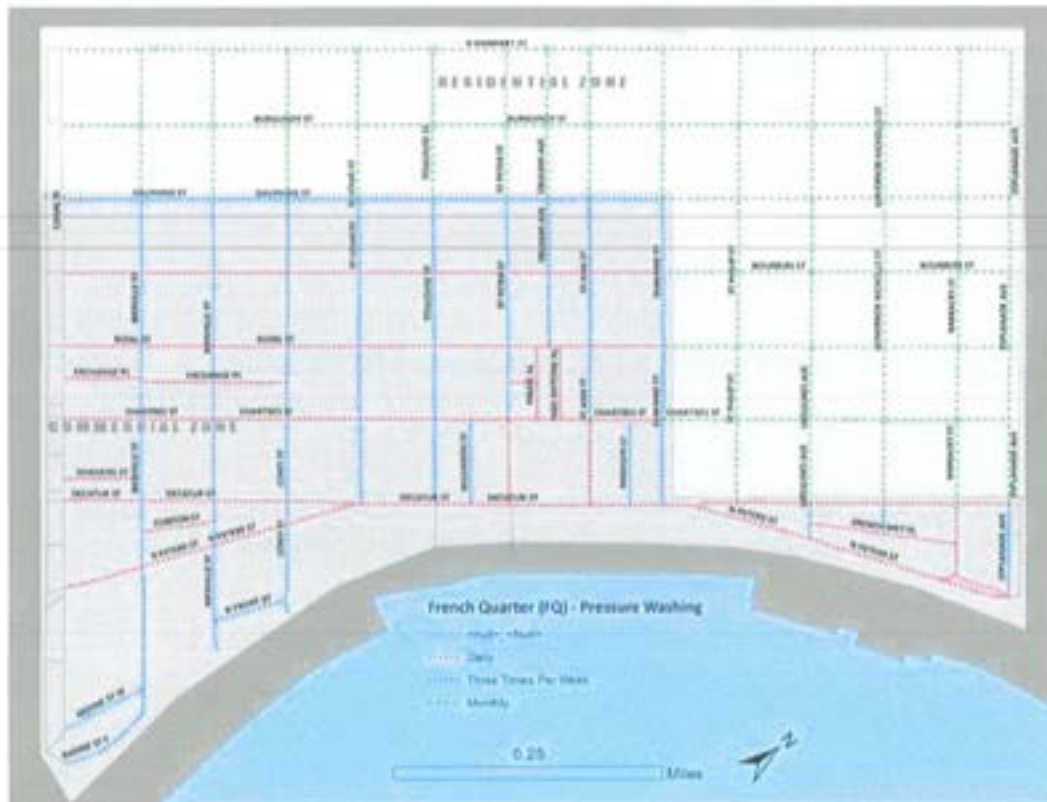

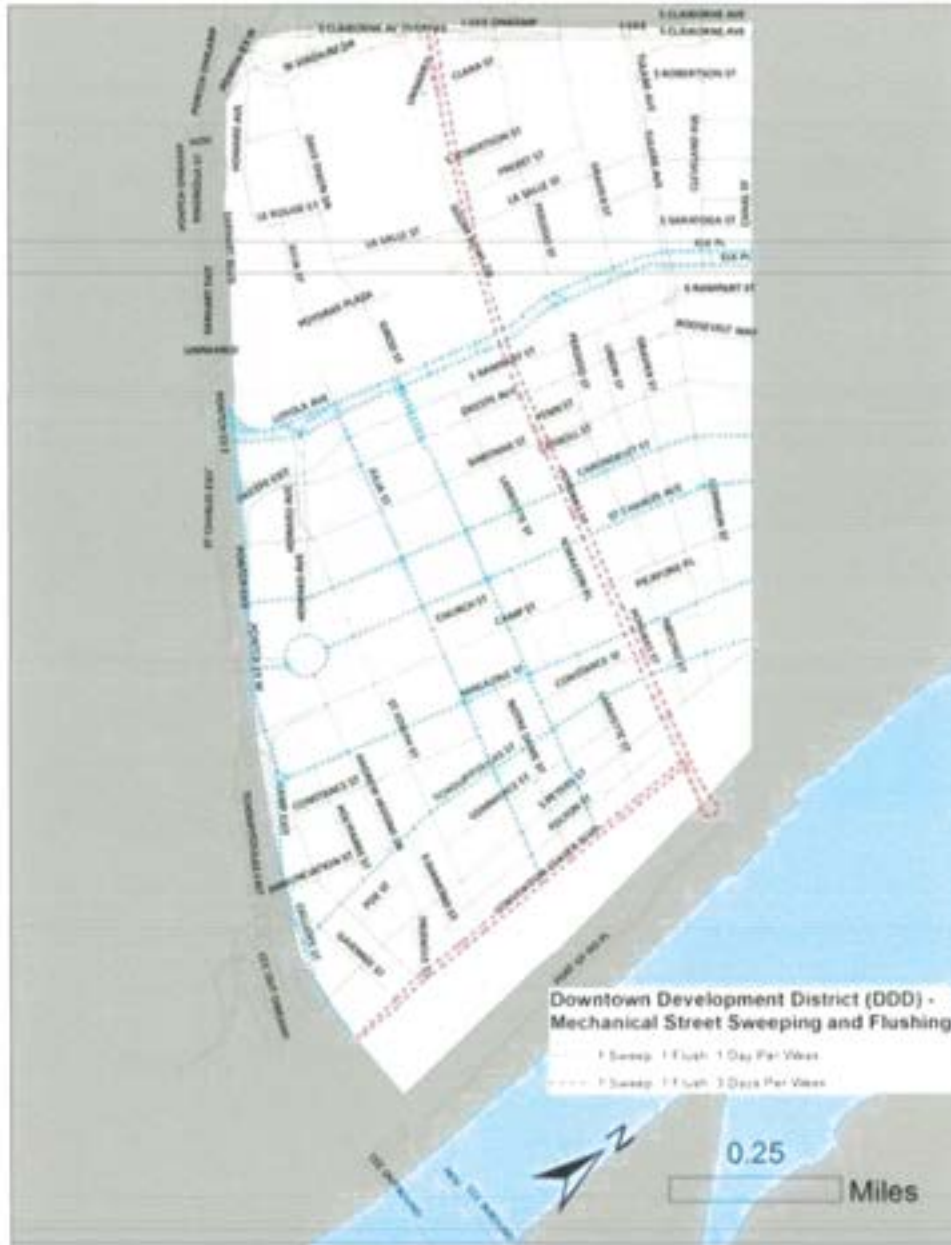
