Summary of Month Activities

5/2/2026

On Saturday, May 2nd, 2026, at approximately 5:30 PM, Sergeant Loy Madrigal was on vehicle patrol in the French Market area when he observed a group of individuals assembled on the sidewalk in the 400 block of Governor Nicholls Street, obstructing pedestrian traffic. Sergeant Madrigal advised the group to clear the sidewalk to allow safe passage for pedestrians and individuals with disabilities, including those using wheelchairs. Most of the individuals complied and left the area. However, one female subject who was accompanied by a large dog remained blocking the sidewalk despite being advised to move. The subject was later identified as Ma'Kayla Alexis Marie, DOB 03/13/2001. Due to her refusal to comply and continued obstruction of the public passageway, Sergeant Madrigal issued the subject a municipal summons for violation of 17271MCS 54-401 — Obstruction of Public Passage. The subject was advised to appear in Municipal Traffic Court located at 727 Broad Street, New Orleans, Louisiana, on May 18th, 2026, at 11:00 AM.

5/2/2026

On Saturday, May 2nd, 2026, at approximately 10:00 AM, Sergeant Madrigal responded to a vacant building located at 2114 Decatur Street in reference to a report of subjects inside the property. The building is owned by Zack Kupperman. Upon arrival, Sergeant Madrigal conducted an exterior check of the property and observed through plain view a person sleeping on the first floor near a hole in the structure believed to have been used as an entry point into the building. Due to the unknown number of occupants and safety concerns, Sergeant Madrigal requested additional assistance from NOPD officers, OPSO deputies, and National Guard personnel who were working in the area. After backup units arrived on scene, officers made entry into the vacant building and conducted a safety sweep and clearing of the structure. During the search, two individuals were located sleeping on the first floor of the building. They were identified as:

- Chase Anthony Howell, white male, DOB 10/27/1995
- Caitlyn Elizabeth Roseberry, white female, DOB 06/03/2004

A third individual was located sleeping on the second floor of the building and identified as:

- Tyler Koppie, white male, DOB 03/27/1998

The subjects were advised they were unlawfully inside the vacant property without permission from the owner. All three subjects were issued summons for violation of municipal ordinance 17271MCS 54-143 Criminal Trespass. They were instructed to appear at Municipal Court located at 727 Broad Street, New Orleans, Louisiana, on May 18th, 2026, at 11:00 AM. The subjects exited the property without incident and the scene was cleared.

Summary of Month Activities

5/6/2026

On Wednesday May 6th, 2026, at approximately 6:00 PM, Sergeant Madrigal was on vehicle patrol in the 2100 block of Decatur Street when he observed a group of individuals trespassing in the rear area of the property located at 2114 Decatur Street, owned by Zack Cupperman. Sergeant Madrigal approached the individuals to investigate the complaint of trespassing. During the investigation, one of the subjects was identified as Tyler Kevin Davis (DOB: 03/16/2001), a white male. Sergeant Madrigal conducted an NCIC inquiry on the subject and learned that Davis was wanted for a municipal attachment under warrant number 12745145. Based on the confirmed warrant information, Sergeant Madrigal detained Davis without incident and advised him of his Miranda rights. Davis was then transported to the NOPD 8th District Station for processing. Further investigation revealed that the warrant was related to failure to appear in court. Sergeant Madrigal issued the subject a summons for violation of municipal ordinance 17271MCS 54-28 Failure to Appear in Court. Davis was advised of his new court date scheduled for May 20th, 2026, at 11:00 AM at Municipal Traffic Court located at 727 Broad Street, New Orleans, Louisiana.

5/9/2026

On Saturday, May 9th, 2026, at approximately 7:20 PM, Sergeant Madrigal and Deputy Joseph Lodwick were on vehicle patrol in the 1200 block of Royal Street when they observed two individuals sitting on the front steps of 1233 Royal Street appearing to prepare for a possible hand-to-hand transaction. One of the individuals, later identified as Maxime Frederick (DOB 03/11/1992), was observed holding a syringe in his right hand. Deputies approached the subjects to investigate further. Upon approach, Sergeant Madrigal observed a clear plastic bag containing an unknown substance lying on the steps to the right side of Mr. Frederick. Deputies also observed multiple unused syringes in plain view inside a white plastic bag near the subject. During a search of the immediate area within Mr. Frederick's wingspan, deputies located a bottle cap containing a powder substance. Sergeant Madrigal recognized Mr. Frederick from a prior encounter in which he had previously been issued a summons approximately two months earlier and failed to appear in court. Mr. Frederick was detained without incident and advised of his Miranda rights. Sergeant Madrigal requested assistance from Detective Madrigal to conduct a field test on the substances recovered. The powder substance found inside the bottle cap tested positive for morphine. The unknown substance located inside the clear plastic bag tested negative for narcotics. During questioning, Mr. Frederick admitted that he had been selling fake heroin to people in exchange for money. Based on the investigation, Mr. Frederick was charged with the following violations:

- LRS 40:967 – Possession of a Schedule II Controlled Dangerous Substance
- LRS 40:1023 – Possession of Drug Paraphernalia
- LRS 40:971.1 – Distribution of Misrepresented Controlled Dangerous Substance

Summary of Month Activities

5/11/2026

On Monday, May 11th, 2026, at approximately 5:50 PM, Sergeant Madrigal was on foot patrol in the 700 block of Canal Street when he was approached by Foot Locker Assistant Manager James Tolliuce at Foot Locker regarding two male subjects suspected of attempting to use a fraudulent credit card to purchase merchandise. Mr. Tolliuce advised that one subject was a white male wearing a black T-shirt, baseball cap, blue sweatpants, and red shoes, while the second subject was a black male wearing a dark-colored hoodie with Saints markings, gold pants, and black shoes. He stated the subjects attempted to purchase several pairs of shoes in different sizes along with clothing items using a credit card belonging to another individual. The transaction was declined. Sergeant Madrigal began canvassing the surrounding area and later observed the white male subject on the 100 block of Carondelet Street appearing to smoke an illegal narcotic using a silver aluminum pipe. Sergeant Madrigal approached the subject, at which time the subject immediately attempted to conceal the pipe inside a small black backpack and denied possessing the pipe. With assistance from responding New Orleans Police Department officers, the subject was detained and identified as Christopher Catanese (DOB 06/01/1986). During the detainment, the silver-colored pipe fell from the backpack onto the ground in plain view. During a pat-down search, Catanese admitted he also had syringes in his left pocket. Sergeant Madrigal continued searching for the second subject and located him inside Domino's Pizza. The subject was detained and identified as Gregory Jerome Marshall (DOB 06/24/1985). While detaining Marshall, Sergeant Madrigal observed a green Capital One Visa bank card under the name of Roberto Torres of AJ Operations LLC concealed beneath napkins on the table where Marshall had been sitting. Both subjects were advised of their Miranda rights and transported to the New Orleans Police Department station for verification and processing.

During the verification process, Christopher Catanese was found to be wanted for theft under item number J-60203-25 out of Gretna, Louisiana. The warrant was verified by NCIC Operator Anderson through Gretna Operator G456. Gregory Jerome Marshall was also found to be wanted for a municipal attachment under warrant number 25M02448, which was verified through NCIC Operator Anderson. Further investigation revealed that the green Capital One Visa card recovered from Marshall matched the card used during the attempted transaction at Foot Locker. Foot Locker cashier Jordin Price positively identified the card as the same card presented during the attempted purchase. Both subjects were charged with Identity Theft under LRS 14:67.16. Additional narcotics and paraphernalia-related charges for Christopher Catanese are pending review based on the recovered pipe and syringes. Both subjects were processed accordingly, and evidence was submitted into evidence procedures under the assigned item number.

5/19/2026

On May 19th, 2026, at approximately 5:30 PM, Sergeant Madrigal observed James Gustowski (DOB 11/30/1988) obstructing the public sidewalk in the 500 block of Governor Nicholls Street. Upon contact, the subject's identity was verified, and a records check revealed an active municipal attachment for failure to appear in court. The attachment was addressed by issuing a municipal summons for 17271MCS 54-28 (Failure to Appear in Court), related to Municipal Attachment #1233105. The subject was served with a new court date and is scheduled to appear before Municipal Court on June 9th, 2026.

Summary of Month Activities

5/23/2026

On Saturday, May 23rd, 2026, at approximately 9:05 AM, Sergeant Madrigal and Deputy Ramon Quezada were on vehicle patrol in the area of 69 French Market Place when they observed a white male wearing a green T-shirt and blue shorts appearing to prepare to inject an unknown narcotic substance into his arm with a syringe. Deputies approached the subject to investigate. Upon seeing the deputies, the subject immediately concealed a syringe with an exposed needle in his right hand and placed it into his right rear pocket. Due to the exposed needle and concern for officer safety, deputies detained the subject and conducted a pat-down for weapons. During the pat-down, deputies located an uncapped syringe in the subject's right rear pocket containing a liquid substance consistent with suspected narcotics. Deputies also searched the subject's immediate arm-span belongings and located another loaded uncapped syringe concealed underneath a black coat. In addition, deputies located a glass pipe containing residue, also concealed beneath the black coat. The subject was advised of his Miranda rights and transported to the NOPD 8th District Station for processing. While at the scene and during processing, the subject refused to identify himself or provide any identifying information to deputies. Based on the investigation, the subject was charged with the following violations:

- LRS 40:967 – Possession of Schedule II Narcotics
- LRS 40:1023 – Possession of Drug Paraphernalia
- LRS 14:108(A) – Refusal to Provide Name and Make Identity Known to Arresting Office.

5/27/2026

On May 27th, 2026, at approximately 8:19 PM, Sergeant Madrigal and Sergeant Darren Vicknair detained Gastinell Kenzith at the 100 block of Royal Street after learning he was wanted through OPSO warrants. The subject was transported to the NOPD 8th District Station for verification of the warrants through OPSO Communications Deputy Badon, who confirmed the warrants as valid.

Summary of Month Activities

5/26/2026

On Tuesday, May 26th, 2026, at approximately 7:30 PM, Sergeant Madrigal and Deputy Thomas Maag were on vehicle patrol in the 800 block of Iberville Street when they observed a group of individuals gathered on the sidewalk appearing to be waiting on a black male subject wearing a blue T-shirt. The subject was later identified as Eugene Samuel Short. As deputies approached the group, Sergeant Madrigal observed Mr. Short holding a white rock-like substance in the open palm of his left hand. Sergeant Madrigal asked Mr. Short what the substance was, and Mr. Short stated that it was “crack cocaine.” Mr. Short was immediately detained for further investigation. His Miranda rights were read and acknowledged. A pat-down search was conducted for officer safety, during which Sergeant Madrigal located a glass pipe containing residue inside Mr. Short’s right front pants pocket. Mr. Short was then transported to the NOPD 8th District Station for processing.

During the search incident to arrest at the station, Sergeant Madrigal located a small clear plastic bag concealed inside Mr. Short’s socks containing a crystal-like substance, along with two additional white rock-like substances wrapped in pieces of paper. The crystal-like substance was field tested using NIK Test Kit Lot Number 2033786, which yielded a positive result for amphetamines. The white rock-like substances recovered from Mr. Short’s hand and socks were field tested using NIK Test Kit Lot Number 002698, which yielded positive results for cocaine. Mr. Short was charged with the following violations:

- LRS 40:967 – Prohibited Acts, Schedule II Narcotics

Summary of Month Activities

5/2/2026

On Saturday, May 2, 2026, Deputy Conner Berthelot of the Orleans Parish Sheriff's Office was working an approved off-duty detail for the Upper Quarter Expansion Patrol. While conducting a walking beat in the 600 block of Frenchmen Street, near the intersection of Frenchmen Street and Chartres Street, Deputy Berthelot heard the distinct audible sound consistent with nitrous oxide being dispensed into latex balloons. Deputy Berthelot then observed a black male, later identified as Mr. Hayes, wearing a white T-shirt and blue jeans, distributing balloons filled with nitrous oxide to members of the general public. Based on these observations, Deputy Berthelot detained Mr. Hayes and confiscated one silver nitrous oxide tank with a black handle, along with multiple latex balloons.

Deputy Berthelot was assisted on scene by Detective Neil Madrigal, who transported Mr. Hayes to the New Orleans Police Department's Eighth District Station for processing. Upon arrival, Deputy Berthelot positively identified Mr. Hayes as the individual observed illegally selling nitrous oxide. Mr. Hayes was subsequently booked into the Orleans Justice Center on one count of Sale of Nitrous Oxide, in violation of the City of New Orleans Municipal Code 271 MCS 54-497 illegal sale of nitrous oxide.
